Requirements

- Maintain Spiritual Focus – this isn't babysitting, we are here to honour the Lord and serve the next generation
- Vision plan – walk alongside our leadership team as we make long term plans in the hope to grow in number and faith
- Connect – build relationships with youth and their families

Youth Ministry

Overview

The ultimate goal of youth ministry is to encourage young people in their faith. Youth usually refers to students ranging from 12 to 18 years old, which is an incredibly impressionable age group. Each student brings their own insecurities and questions to the table, so they will rely on their youth leaders for guidance and support as they navigate the most challenging part of their development in their walk with Christ. Youth ministry provides a safe place for teenagers to be themselves and exercise their freedom to learn more about God and who he is.

Youth ministry leaders should have a firm grasp of biblical principals and understand ethics appropriately to work effectively with young people. In addition, they must understand modern influences on Christianity, to identify with youth and build meaningful relationships with them, ultimately helping youth grow spiritually in their formative years and equip them to make an impact for Christ both now and in their future.

Responsibilities

Research and implement appropriate & engaging curriculum for use during youth nights and other teaching times

Organize bi-weekly events for fun youth activities; Also includes organizing Sunday youth activities and Bible Study

Encourage youth programs for services: songs, poems, skits, etc.

Create opportunities for youth to help in the community by organizing age appropriate service activities

Manage youth helpers and other volunteers, including scheduling and curriculum

Maintain proper records and ensure compliance with safe practices based on the Plan to Protect model.

Communicate with parents about their children's involvement in upcoming events and weekly activities.

Communicate with leadership regarding upcoming events and updates.
